Eunice Louise McClurkin Posset, age 100 formerly of White Township, died on Monday, January 19, 2015 at the Reformed Presbyterian Home in Pittsburgh, Pa. Mrs. Posset met her husband, John R. Posset in Erie, Pennsylvania and they were married on November 23, 1974, at the Geneva Reformed Presbyterian Church in Beaver Falls, Pennsylvania. Mrs. Posset was president of the Pittsburgh Presbyterian Women's Missionary Society and a member of the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages and the American Association of Teachers and French. Mrs. Posset was a member of the First Reformed Presbyterian Church in Patterson Twp., PA; formerly known as Geneva Reformed Presbyterian Church.

Besides her parents, Mrs. Posset was preceded in death by her husband, John Robert Posset on December 18, 2012.
