WILL OF GEORGE CHERRY - MADE 2/25/1867 - Perry County & Will Red. B, Page 1 Died Testate before May 21, 1867

"I, George Cherry, in the County of Perry and State of Illinois, do hereby make and Declare this my Last will and Testament in manner and form following to wit: First, it is my will that my funeral Expenses and all my just dobts be fully paid.

Second, after the payment of such funneral Expenses and debts, I give, devise, and bequeath, unto my Daughter Sarah Cherry, etherwise Dunlop, the Sum of Five Dollarrs to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Third, I give, devise, and bequeath unto the three heirs of my Deceased Daughter Rebeca Jeane, who was intermarried with David Willson, the sum of five Dellars (\$5.00) cash each, making in all fifteen Dellars and their heirs and assigns forever.

Third, I give and Devise unto my Daughter Mary McClurkin, formerly Cherry the sum of four Hundred Dellars to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Also my herse and waggen.

Fourth, I give and devise and bequesth unto my Daughter Martha Ann, Adams, wife of Samuel H. Adams the sum of Three Hundred Dellears to her and her heirs and assigns forever. Also, a certain Tract of Land No. as follows. The North West part forty Acres of the South West quarter of Section No. 32 Township Three South of Range four West laying and being in Washington County and State of Illinois to her and her heirs and assigns forever.

Fifth, I give and devise and bequeath unt my Daughter Ellen McMillan, Wife ef James W. McMillan the Sum of Five Dellars to her and her heirs and assigns ferever.

Sixth, I give and devise and bequeath untermy Son, James A. Cherry, all the Ballance, Ressi-, and Remainder of my property bothe Real and personal to him and to his heirs and assigns forever.

Ninth, all the Just Debts and Leggiteas all heir must be paid up.

And lastly, Thereby Constitute and apoint Samuel H. Adams and James A. Cherry of Perry County, Executors of this my last will and Testament, Reveking and
