### SUICIDE AT WEST FRANKFORT

The following is an excerpt from a West Frankfort paper concerning Harrison AVERY, who is well known at Oakdale.

... Mr AVERY was employed at Orient No 1, as a maintenance man, and the nature of his position afforded him work, even during the time the mine is closed. ... Deceased is survived by his widow and three children. ...

Harrison P. AVERY was born near Frankfort, Oct 1, 1888, and departed this life May 25, 1928, at the age of 39 yrs, 7 mths & 24 da. He was united in marriage to Blanche KIRKPATRICK of Oakdale on Jan 9 1913. To this union were born three children, Robert, 12, Marion, David James McCreight born Aug. 14, 1855, died March 28, 1934. Elma Cameron, wife of Frank White McQuilkin, born Oct. 1876, died Oct. 24, 1938, New York, burial Marisa Cemetery.

Robert J. McQuilkin died May 8, 1930 at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Glenn Lucas, in Marissa, Ill. He was the son of the late Mr & Mrs. George McQuilkin of Marissa. He was born in Bristol, PA. He was married to Miss Margaret White, who preceded him in death about ten years ago. He is survived by four daughters and three sons, Mrs. Elwood McClurkin and Mrs. James R. Rev. James McMaster McQuilkin. pastor of the United Presbyterian Church at Carnegie, Pa., and a native of this city, died at a Pittsburgh, Pa., hospital Monday afternoon (Nov. 23, 1942). Rev. McQuilkin was born in Marissa April 14, 1876, the son of the late Robert J. and Margaret McQuilkin, nee White. His father was born in Pennsylvania and his mother in Randolph County, Illinois. He married Irene Smiley at the home of her parents, three miles south of this city in May 1901-? Besides his widow, he is survived by a son, Francis Smiley McQuilkin, United States Army.
