This document is a portion of the research of Mrs. Frank S. Torrens with some help from her daughter, Miss M. Louise Torrens. It was “published” in 1958.

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The McClurken clan, as most of its members know, is Scotch-Irish.

The Scotch-Irish are the descendants of Scotch Presbyterians who emigrated first to North Ireland & a few generations later came to America.

The Scotch Presbyterians, or better known "Covenanters", in the 16th & 17th centuries suffered most severe persecution & martyrdom for their faith, at the hands of rule, whether Roman Catholic or Protestant. To escape many, particularly in the 17th century, fled to the north coast of Ireland, where they were promised immunity from persecution. No doubt a McClurken family was among these.

This promise of freedom from religious persecution in Ireland, was not kept tho it was possibly never as severe as it had been in Scotland. The continued persecution was one reason for later moving to America. However the move was probably influenced as much by economic motives as by religious considerations. They had found life very hard in North Ireland, & living very precarious. And so, when free lands were offered, immigrants to America, many thousands responded, settling largely in Penn. & the Carolinas. the descendants of these are known today, as Scotch-Irish.

This migration to America was probably heaviest between 1725-1775. Among those who came on the latter part of this period was a McClurken Family, or rather, at least 2 families, possibly brothers. Evidence of 2 families settling in the same section & at near the same time is quite conclusive. These 2 families settled in Chester Co. S. Car. The next generation scattering into Fairfield, Laurens & Spartansburg Co. One of these families arrived about the end of 1772. Two sons of the other family had come a few yrs. earlier, as single young men, but there is a tradition handed down in one branch of this family, that it arrived on one of the last ships to enter the port of Charleston, before it was blockaded by the British in the Rev. War. The parents & other children evidently followed the sons who had come earlier. We found one other McClurken name in the early records of the same section of S. Car., which we have not been able to place in either of these 2 first families, but found no record of any descendants.

While we have not to date been able to trace some branches of these 2 families, we have traced & catalogued more than 10,000 of their descendants, or about 85% of all the McClurken clan we have been able to locate in America at the present time. The other 15% are descendants of 5 families who came to America, from 1825-1880.

We believe that all McClurkens, (at least all those in America), are descended from the 1st family that settled in Ireland. We have asked of every group of McClurkens we have contacted to tell us if they knew, from what point in Ireland their ancestors had come. Without exception they would say, from Co. Antrim. Almost all go further & say from Ballymoney (or Ballymena), which are towns not far apart in the northern part of Co. Antrim. Still a further evidence of this single origin, is that the name is found nowhere in the world except Ireland, G Britain, U.S., Canada & possibly Australia. And the name McClurken, is a very uncommon name in all these countries.

We have nothing definite regarding the origin of the name "McClurken". It probably began with the name Cluer or Clure. The Mac or Mo was prefixed to give McClure or son of Clure. Later the Scotch ending "kin" was added, meaning related to. The name McClurken, then means "related to the McClure's". There also is a story said to have been brought from Ireland by the late Dr. John Knox McClurken of Pittsburgh. According to this story the name of the family when they left Scotland, for Ireland, was McLaud, & in Ireland it was changed to McClurken for religious reasons.

It is perhaps worth while to note the variations in the spelling of the name McClurken. We only have to go back a few hundred yrs to find much variation in the spelling of very ordinary words. There was still more variation in the spelling of Surnames. This was no doubt due to the fact that English had not become a "fixed" language, as it is now & also to the fact that there was very much more illiteracy than now & many surnames were phonetically or as each person thought best fitted the sound.

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In the early records of S.Car. we find both McClurkens & McClurkins & at least one branch adopting McLurkin. These are all members of the 2 families in America. Among descendants of these 2 families today we find McClurkin, McClurken, McClerkin, McLurkin, & McLerkin. The descendants of those who came from Ireland later are found using some of the above spellings except in 2 instances. The descendants of a Hugh McClurkin who came from Ireland to Penn. about 1825 all spell the name McClurkin, tho the priginal Hugh used the spelling McClurkin. A family living in Wash. & Calif. spell their name "McClarkin." tho we have reason to believe they are cousins of a family of "McClurkins" who live in Phila. & in Nab. whose fathers came over from 1865-1875. But however the name is spelled they are all of the same family.

The McClurken family is a God-fearing people, All when they came to America were Presbyterians & most all of them were "Covenanters". Many are still in the Cov. Church or some other branch of the Presby. Church, tho some are found now in almost all denominations of the Protestant church.

The family as a whole has believed in education, many of them having been college bred. Some physicians attorneys are found among them but the teaching & ministry has led all other professions. Among the ministers some were noted. The leader among them was Dr. John Knox McClurkin, pastor of Shadyside U.P. Church of Pittsburgh for over 30yrs. He was a gifted & eloquent preacher & was probably the most widely known of all McClurkins.

Not only the sons, but daughters also have been patriots in our wars. From the first S.Car. families at least 5 sons fot in the Rev. War. One, Archibald, while at home on a furlough & very sick with small-pox, was taken from his bed by the Tory, Col Philips on orders of the British Gen. Tarlton, & hanged to a tree in his dooryard & with his mother looking on. And a daughter, Jane McClurkin, is said to have carried a message to Gen. Nathaniel Greene during the Rev. War. She is said to have ridden a horse for miles following blazed trees & crossing Broad River. The message was carried hidden in her hair.

Not all the McClurkins came North, some of those in the South fot for the Confederate cause. Many of those who did come north fot on the side of the Union, & some on both sides gave their life in the struggle. A number of the clan were in service in W.W.I. & W.W.II & many are yet in service of their country today.-found in Navy, Marine, Army & Aviation. A noted one of the Clan, is Brig. Gen. Norman F Ramsay, once in command of the Arsenal at Rock Island, Ill.

The 2 families who settled in S.Car. before the Rev. War. we believe to be those of James & Robert McClurkin. The family of Jas. is well established, by the lands on arrival will of Jas the father, & of his son John & daughter Jane McClurkin Weir. The family of Robert is being followed by deeds. Rev. War services & traditions handed down in some of branches of the family.

All that we know directly about Robt. McClurkin is that he received a grant of land from the province of S. Car. His son John deeded this land to Wm. Smith, in 1797, & the deed recites that it had been granted to Robt. McClurken & had come from Robt. to John by birthright, so we know Robt was John's father. Their is a strong tradition among the descendants of Thos. & Mathew McClurkin, that 4 sons came to America in the 1st family, namely; Thos, Arch, John & Mathew, as well as 4 daughters. Since S. Car. records seem to show but 2 John McClurkins in the period following the Rev. & one of them is definitely identified in the Jas. McClurkin family, the other John is evidently the brother of Thos, Arch, & Mathew. So we build the family as follows, tho incomplete;-

According to tradition, 4 of the family, 2 sons & 2 daughters, remained in Ireland, so the ages may seem quite far apart or irregular, but we shall enumerate those we find in America, as 1, 2, 3 etc.

1. Thos. McClurkin we take as the oldest of the family, He married Eliz, Smith, sister of David Smith of Bloomington Ind. in 1790. Eliz. was born 1767 & died 1852. Both were born in Ireland. In 1833 when Thos was 85 yrs old, he & wife moved along with several of their sons from South Carolina to near Oakdale, Illinois. Thomas served in the Revolution with South Carolina Militia from Chester County. He received a pension from 3/4 1831 until his death, the annual pension being \$55.00. He and Elizabeth had five sons, John (1792-1874), Archibald (1794-1858), James (1801-1875), Thomas (1805-1867), David (1811-1880), and one daughter, Nancy (1797-1857). Thomas and Elizabeth are buried in Elkhorn Cemetery near Oakdale, Illinois, where many of their descendants are buried also.

2. Matthew Henry McClurkin (1756-1847) was probably not the second son. According to tradition four, two sons and two daughters remained in Ireland. These were probably among the older ones who had married and had families there. Matthew married Jennet McClurkin (--- D. before 1796) (she was a daughter of James McClurkin father of the other first McClurkin family), They married about 1786. Their children James (1787-1851), John (1790-1865), Catherine (1792-1869), and Nancy or Agnes (1794-1875).

After Jennet's death Matthew married again about 1800 to Mrs. Mary Gaston Elliott (1773-1822). Their children were Jane or Jennie (1801-1853), Joseph (1803-1874), Letitia (1806-1863), Isabel (1808-1887), Archibald (1810-1876), son (b & d about 1812), Mary Ann (1814-1895), Elizabeth (1816-1844).

Matthew and Mary removed with the family from South Carolina to Union County, Ind. near the Ohio line, in 1806. They were members of the Covenanter church at Morning Sun, Ohio, and are both buried in the Morning Sun Cemetery. Matthew like his brother Thomas served in S. Car. Militia from Chester County. Matthew with all his brothers and sisters was born in Ireland.

3. John McClurkin (--- D 1819) married in --- Elizabeth ---. Their children as shown by his will were Sarah, Elizabeth, Molly and John. The wife Elizabeth died in December 1831. Sarah married William Trussel and Molly or Mary married Samuel Gibson, both before 1813 when the father wrote his will. Elizabeth married Robert Gordon between 1813 and 1831 when Elizabeth, the mother, wrote her will. We do not know when or if John ever married. We have not been able up to the present, to trace any descendants of William and Sarah Trussel, of Robert and Elizabeth Gordon, or of John McClurkin. We do have about 600 of the descendants of Samuel and Molly Gibson traced and catalogued.

John like his brothers fought in S. Car. Militia from Chester County. He and his wife both died in Chester County, S.C. Samuel and Molly McClurkin Gibson moved from S. Carolina to near Oakdale, Ill. in 1833.

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4. Archibald McClurkin (--- d 1-14-1780) fought in the S. Car. Militia in the Revolution. While the British were in control of most of S. Car. Archibald went home on a furlough, sick with smallpox. Tories in the neighborhood learned of his presence and advised the British. General Tarleton sent Colonel Philips with some Tories who took him from his bed and hanged him to a tree in the yard. This occurred two days before the battle of Cowpens where Gen. Tarleton was gloriously defeated. It is said that Col. Phillips was shot on the streets of Ballymoney, Ireland after the war, but not fatally, and he lived afterward in constant fear of the avenger and died a drunkard and in destitution. He was shot by a brother of Archibald, but whether by one who had gone back from America for that purpose or by one of the two brothers who had remained in Ireland is not known. It is believed that he was not married.

5. Isabella McClurkin (--- d after 1833) remained in Ireland when the family came to America. She married about 1884 in Ireland, Hugh Kirkpatrick. They came to America with their family about 1820. Their children were Jennie (--- ---), James (1787-1842), John (1800-1823), Rebecca (--- ---), Hugh (1803-1879), Margaret (1796-1843), Elizabeth (1801-1876), Mary (1803-1852), Martha (1808-1889). Isabella was living in 1833 for she was a member of the Covenanter church at Elkhorn, near Oakdale at that time.

6. Mary McClurkin (1769-1831), born in Ireland came with her parents to America, married about 1787 in S. Carolina, to Robert Hood (1737-1825). Mary is buried in Old Bethel Cemetery, Sparta, Ill., and Robert is buried Richmond Covenanter cemetery on Mitford Road, Chester Col, S.C. Their children were Elizabeth (1788-1847), John B. (1792-1861), James (1789-1825), Margaret (1796-1864), and Archibald (1800-1872). Mary moved with most of her children to Oakdale, Ill., probably about 1830.

7. Elizabeth McClurkin (1770-1844), probably came with her parents from Ireland. She married Andrew McQuiston in 1788 in Chester County, S.C. (The McQuiston genealogy says she was married in Ireland and came to America in 1794 according to tradition. Andrew McQuiston a single man received a grant of 100 acres of land in Fairfield, County, S.C. in 1787. We believe this is the man Elizabeth married in 1788). They moved within a few years to near Hartstown, Crawford Co., Penn. Their children were Mary (1789-1853), Martha (1791-1877), Hugh (1794-1867), Isabel (1796-1838), Robert (1799-1870), John (1800-1883), Elizabeth (1802-1842), Jane or Janet (1804-1888), William (1806-1879), Murdock (1810-1882), Nancy (1813-1854). Both Andrew and Mary are buried in South Shenango cemetery not far from Hartstown, Pa.

The above are not all of the Robert McClurkin family. Tradition says that four sons and four daughters came to America with their parents and that two sons and two daughters stayed behind in Ireland. We do not think the four sons all came from Ireland with their parents. Thomas must have come as early as 1768, since he received 100 acres of land at that time in Chester Co., S. C. There is record of only one other Thomas McClurkin in early records found in S. C. and he is definitely placed in the James McClurkin family, so Thomas, son of Robert, must have come earlier. Also there is a tradition that two McClurkin brothers came over earlier than the rest of the family. Tradition says the rest of the family (that is two sons, four daughters and the parents) came to America in one of the last ships to enter Charleston before the Revolutionary war broke out. Of the fourth daughter who came (if four came) we have no records. Nor any of those who never came to America.

8. Nancy McClurken b d 7-20-1848 Morning Sun Iowa m John
McClure b 1757 d 11-3-1837 Morning Sun Ohio
They are supposed to have moved from S. Car. to Ohio about 1810 when Mathew McClurken moved.

9. Robt McClurken (perhaps the eldest) b Ire 1740 d 1786 S. Car. m Martha --
b 1746 d 1806

Robert McClurkin b in Ire.

Tradition says that Thomas & Mathew McClurkin, or two of the brothers, came to South Carolina from Ire. about 1772. Thomas McClurkin's pension papers give this date. The family is supposed to have followed about 1776, & landed at Charleston, So. Car. Tradition says that there were 12 children of the family of Robert McClurkin, 6 sons & 6 daughters, & that 2 sons & 2 daughters stayed in Ire. The family came from Balley money, Co. Antrim, Ire., to Chester Co. So. Carolina.

Below are the members of this family that can be accounted for; 10 children.

(*) His tombstone gives the birthyear as 1745, stone placed by the government. Tombstone placed by the family gives birthyear as 1748, but his pension papers give his birthyear as 1756, which seems more accurate, with the rest of the family.

John McClurken b 1757 Ire. d 1- -1819 So. Car. m 1783 So. Car. Elizabeth----
b 1752 d 12- -1831 So. Car.

Archibald McClurken b 1758 Ire, d 1-14-1780 So. Car.

Supposed to have been single.

Archibald McClurken was hung by the Tories, while sick with the Small-pox at his home, during the Revolutionary War. He was a soldier in the Revolutionary War.

Mathew Hy. McClurken b 1756 Or 1761 Ire. d 5-1-1847 bur Beechwoods Cem. Morning Sun, Ohio. m 1786 So. Car. Jennet McClurken a daughter of Jas. McClurken, b 1765 Ira. d 1797 So. Car. he m 2nd 1800 So. Car. Mrs Mary Gaston Elliott b 8-22-1773 d 2-21-1822 Beechwoods Cem. Morning Sun Ohio. Mathew McClurken moved from So. Car. to Ohio before 1810. Probably Mathew & his first wife, Jennet McClurken, were 1st cousins.

Isabelle McClurken b 1768 d after 1840 Ill. m 1786 Ire. Robert Kirkpatrick b 1760 Ire. d 1820-1830 So. Car. Came from Ire to So. Car. after 1820.

Mary McClurken b 1769 Ire. d 8-7-1831 bur Old Bethel Cem. N.E. of Sparta Ill. m 1787 So. Car. Robert Hood b 1737 d 3-16-1825 bur Richmond Covenanter Cem. in So. Car. Moved from So. Car. to Washington Co. Ill. 1830.

Elizabeth McClurken b 1770 Ire. d 8-29-1844 bur So. shenango Cem. near Hartstown, Pa. m 1788 So. Car. Andrew McQuiston b 1763 Ire, d 11-19-1830 bur So. Shenango Cem. Pa. Supposed to have moved from Sp. Car. to Pa. in 1810

Nancy McClurken b 1772 Ire. (or So. Car.) d 7-20-1848 bur Rice Cem. Morning Sun Ohio. m 1795 So. Car. John McClure b 1757 d 11-3-1837 bur Beechwoods Cem. Morning Sun Ohio. Supposed to have moved from So. Car. to Ohio with Mathew McClurken in 1810.

Robt McClurken b d before 1790 Probably killed in Revolutionary War. There are payments to a Robt. McClurken between 1780-1785 for services in Rev. War m name unknown

John McClurken b about 1773 in So. Car. Inherited 100 Acres of land from his father Robt. McClurken, which he sold to Wm Smith about 1797, Chester Co. So. Car.

Old records are difficult to read & could be confused, Probably this Robt. & this Richard are the same. Richard received 150 Acres of land for himself & wife. There was a Richard who came from Ire. on the ship "Free Mason" in 1772, who Received land on 1-6-1773, on the same date as James McClurken family did.

James McClurken b
Held property in India.

James McClurkin came from Ireland to Chester Co.S.Car.about the end of the yr 1772.all members of the family over 16 yrs old applied for land grants in a petition presented to the council on 1-6-1773. The petition recited they recently arrived in the province on the ship "Lord Dunluce" & lists th following in a group among a large number that came on the ship & applied at the same time for land.

Each single person over 16 yrs could receive a grant of 100 Acres of land.

Each married man without children could receive 150 Acres. If a man had children he could get an additional 50 Acres for each child under 16 yrs of age.

We believe the spelling of all but Thomas is an error in the spelling made by the one who made up the petition or a misreading of an almost illegible old manuscript. We have not seen the original MMs.

In Chester Co.S.Car. records we have found a will of Jas McClurken,dated 1-9-1794 & filed for probate 9-21-1794. A list of legatees follows;

A comparison of the names in this will with those in the petition for lands above, indicate that Catharine, John & Jennet were under 16 when the petition was made for lands. Also Mary probably died between the time of the petition & the making of the will, & without children. It also indicates that Samuel, Eleanor, Jean (or Jane) Catharine, & Jennet were all single in 1- -1773, but were all married & with children in 1794. And that Jas, John, & Lillas (or Lilly) were single in 1773 but had married & had children & had died before 1794.

Incidently we note Jas mentions in the will only those grandsons, who bore his name James, with the exception of his son Jas Children, who received a greater portion than any others, possibly because they as orphans may have had a greater need. Also we note that Jennet's son is named Jas McClurken, Thru this & other circumstantial evidence we have concluded that Jennet was the first wife of Mathew McClurken, son of Robert(his brother) We also note that Jas McClurken in the petition above asks for 300 Acres of land. This is the amount he is entitled to ask for, for himself, his wife, Catharine, John & Jennet, all 3 under 16 yrs.

1. Mary McClurken is the first named of the daughters. We do not know the date of her birth but her sister Jean was born in 1749, so she probably was born in 1747. The only reference to her is in the list of those who petitioned for land in 1773. We believe she died before her father's will was written, & unmarried or at least without children, since none are named in the will.

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2. Jane McClurken or Jean, 1749-1852 married David Weir in Chester Co. S. Car. about 1776. David Weir died 1797 in Chester Co. S. Car. Their children were; Samuel Weir b about 1777. Jas McClurken Weir 1779-1838, John Weir 1781-1817, Thos Weir , Martha Weir Catharine Weir , David Weir , Eleanor Weir 1794-1836, Mathew Weir 1797-1870. They never left that section of S. Car. tho most of their descendants today live across the line in Fairfield Co. This is the most prolific branch of the whole McClurken family. We have listed & catalogued more than 2000 & several of the children's lines we have thus far been unable to trace. Jane is the daughter mentioned as carrying a message hid in her hair, riding horseback for miles following a blazed trail & across Broad River, to deliver the message to Gen Nathaniel Greene. She lived to the age of 103 yrs. the oldest McClurken of whom we have any record.

3. Thos. McClurken married Jane or Jenny somebody, as is shown by a deed to land in Laurens Co. S. Car. which is signed by Thos McClurken & by Jane or Jenny McClurken his wife. A. Jean or Jane McClurken is listed in the census of 1790 which was taken mostly in the years from 1772-1775 as living in Spartansburgh Co. & with a household of 1 M under 16 & 6 F. However Thos McClurken was living as late as 1793 when he made the deed in Laurens Co. which is signed by his wife Jane. But if he died in 1793 it is quite possible the 1790 census may have been taken of his family after his death. He also owned land in Spartansburgh Co. & probably lived there. He deeded away a piece of land there in 1784 & again another in 1785. We have been unable to pick any trace of their descendants tho according to the census they must have had 1 son & 5 daughters unless others were living with Jane at the time.

4. Eleanor McClurken 1754-1838 married 1775 Wm. Young. He is said to have been a Tory in the Rev. War. We know nothing of him except that they lived in Chester Co S. Car. But since he was a Tory he probably was either killed or die during the Rev. or like most Tories left America with the British soldiers at the close of the War. They had 2 children Mary 1776-1872, & Andrew , Mary married Thos. McDill & we have found almost all of her descendants listed in geneology of the McDills by Woods. We have been unable to find any descendants of Andrew Young, tho he is supposed to have been living in S. Car. at the time of his mother's death. Eleanor McClurken Young married 2nd John Maben (or Maybin) in Chester Co. S. Car. & lived there untill his death 1819. After which she lived with her daughter Mary McDill in Ohio, near Morning Sun, Preble Co. until her death.

5. Samuel McClurken 1756-1804 married & had 2 sons, Jas 1788-1830, & Samuel 1792 - We do not know the name of his wife tho we think it may have been Jane Ghent. There is a tradition in one branch at least, of his descendants that her name was Ghent. We also found a record of a Jane McClurkin being appointed guardian of some minor McCullough children in Laurens Co. S. Car in 1809. The McCulloughs were cousins of Samuel McClurkin according to some of his descendants. (Possibly Lillas McClurkens descendants). Samuel McClurken lived in Laurens Co. owned land there & is listed there in the 1790 census. This census lists 2 sons under 16 yrs which would be correct according to the record, but it also lists 3 females. So Samuel either had 2 dau. at that time or some others were living in their home. Quite possibly there were 2 dau. who may have ~~married~~ died unmarried before the father. The 2 sons are the only heirs of record.

6. Lillas McClurken must have married in Chester Co. S. Car. but died before her father made his will in 1794 since he bequeathes to her children. He does not name her children or state how many there are. We have not from Samuel Perry McClurken of Stevens Ark. that the McCullough family were either 1st or 2nd cousins of his father & he is sure they were on the McClurken side of the family. We have found later that Lillas married John Baird.

7. Jas McClurken like Lillas is mentioned only indirectly in his father's will as "Jas children". Jas evidently died before his father but we have no will & no deeds in which his name appears. We know now nothing further.

8. Catharine McClurken married a Mr. Boyd, according to her father's will. She had a son Jas. & may have had other sons & daughters. There are many Boyd's in that section Of Chester Co. & some in Ill that came from S. Car. but as yet are unable to trace the exact connections.

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9. John McClurken must have been born about 1765 & died in 1793 He married Mgt. Walthe about 1786. They had 2 children, Andrew 1787-1858, & Jas 1790-1866. John lived & died in Fairfield Co. S. Car. He died about 2 yrs before his father died. We have about a pl the descendants of both of his sons listed & catalogued.

10. Jennet McClurken married about 1786 in Chester Co. S. Car. to Mathew McClurken, son of Robt. McClurken. This is supported only by circumstantial evidence but it seems conclusive. Their children as given under Mathew McClurken in the record of the Robt. McClurken family, were; Jas 1787-1851, John 1790-1865, Catharine 1792-1869, Agnes or Nancy 1794-1875. Jennet died in S. Car. After Mathew's 2nd marriage the family moved to eastern Indiana.

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The - Robert McClurken Family.

If you should take the negroes from me, I will be at a great loss, as I am getting old.

You & Frank are both young, & I think it very hard if you should deprive me of them, but agreeable to the marriage settlement made by your mother, I can have no claim to them, only by your own good kindness for your old & affectionate father,

Let me know whether you should send for them or come up yourself & you can have them, but I hope you will have some regard to old age. Tell Frank it is out of my power to come to Otland this winter, but if I keep my health this Spring, I will try to come down & show him how to fish for brime & trout. Tell Frank to take good care how he handles his Kain (cane) if he remembers how he like to put out one of my eyes by bobbing, No more at present, as my pen is worn out to thr grissle. Remember me to all my friends, not forgetting my worthy friend Mr. Renolds, for I think that's his name, if my memory do not fail me.

My kind love to Frank & my little grandchildren. No more at present, but in heart, I remain your ever

Know all men by these presents, that I, Mary Ann Zuill, in consideration of the natural love & affection which I have & bear for my only daughter, Martha Ann Zuill, & for & towards the better support & maintenance of her after my decease & divers other good causes & valuable consideration, me thereunto especially moving, have given, granted & sold, & by these presents do give, grant & sell unto the said Martha Ann, the goods & chattels herein named, to wit; Jemimah, the negro woman slave mentioned in the said marriage settlement & her children, first, Mary & her child, James. second, Caesar a boy of 10 yrs of age. third, Mgt a girl of 8 yrs of age. fourth, Wm a boy 5 yrs of age, fifth, Thos. a boy 2 yrs of age, together with all their future issue & increase. Also 4 feather beds, & the furniture to them belonging, 1 mahogany bedstead, 2 mattresses, 1 settee, 1 set of mahogany dining tables, 1 mahogany tea table, 1 chest of drawers, 2 pair of brass dog irons, 1 shovel & tongs, 18 setting chairs, 1 dozen silver table spoons, 1 silver soup spoon, 1 silver milk pot, 1 dozen teaspoons, one pair silver tea tongs, 1 pair of silver sauce pans, 1 silver waiter, & 1 set of plated castors, 1 pair of plated decanter stands, & 5 tea trays, & all the other personal property settled upon me in the said marriage settlement, & named therein, & in the schedule thereunto annexed marked A.

And whereas, by a deed of gift dated 3-29-1827, Mary Ann Zuill did give, grant & convey unto her, Martha Ann, certain personal property, consisting of negroes, etc., as will more fully appear by a reference to said deed of gift, to be possessed & enjoyed by the said Martha A., after the demise of said Mary A., & whereas a marriage is intended shortly to be had & solemnized between the said Francis B Durant & the said Martha Ann & whereas it is the intention of all the parties to these articles of agreement, that the said Francis B. Durant shall have the management & Caottracts after the solemnization of said marriage, for the joint benifit of himself & his intended wife, during their natural lives, provided that the said property & every part thereof shall not be liable to be sold for the satisfaction of fulfillment of any contracts, debts or engagements of the said Francis B. & whereas it hath been further agreed that the said Francis B., having first obtained the approbation in writing of the said Thos Pringle, his execytor or administrator, shall have full power to sell & convey away the said lots of land in Sumterville, as aforesaid & with the maney arising from the sale thereof, to purchase other real or personal property to be subject to the same conditions & to the same uses & trusts to be hereafter expresses as the said lots of land are. And whereas it hath been further agreed that if the said Martha A survive the said Francis B. she shall be permitted to have, use, occupy & enjoy all and singular the said property during her widowhood, & after her marriage or decease, the said Thos. Pringle his executors or administrators shall assign & transfer & convey unto the said Martha Ann all & singular the said property & whereas it hath been further agreed that if the daid Francis B. shall survive the said Martha A., leaving issue alive, child or children, in the said intended marriage to be begotten, the said Francis B. shall have & receive all the interests & profits of said property to be begotten, ~~the said Francis B. shall have & receive all the interests~~ during his lifetime & after his death the said property shall be equally divided between the children. Dear Miss Meyer;

I am endeavoring to reply to yours of Mar. 10, 1941. You will find a copy of a letter written to me by my Uncle Rev. J.J. McClurken, which will give you a better picture of our branch of the McClurken Clan, than I can. This letter was written June 29, 1896. He was my father's oldest brother, & was at this time 84 yrs old & retired.

You spoke of the original family of 4 boys & 4 girls coming to America with their parents in 1776. Now, as I remember g-father speaking of the matter to my father, there were only 2 boys originally that came to America. - Arch. & Thos., one was 17 & the other 19 yrs of age. They were fugitives from Eng. as they had been involved in the Irish Rebellion, & Eng. was trying to get their hands on them. This must have been prior to 1776, because I remember the story that the British Officer who performed the execution of Arch. McClurken, had his wife & children witness the execution as he remarked, as an example to other rebels. He (Arch) was home, ill, being a Rev. War soldier & was delirious at the time of the execution. He speaks of it being at the roadside, whereas as I remember, g-father spoke of it in his own door yard. Remember I was but a small boy, when I heard this, therefore I may not be quite accurate, altho such stories remain vividly in a small boy's mind.

Hugh Park McClurken was another Rev., a 2nd younger brother of J.J. McClurken, there being 2 preachers in this family of 8 boys. There were also 2 girls. I do not remember of having seen the girls. Uncle J.J. had 2 children. John Knox McClurken, a preacher, (but he is in error here so will leave it out).

Rev. Hugh Park McClurken had 6 children, 4 girls & 2 boys, Juliet, Emma, Eva & Carrie. The boys Thaddeus & Albert, both of them preachers. I visited Uncle Hugh's family when they were living at Wahoo, Neb. As I remember, Uncle was living in Topeka Kan. when he died. You speak of your mother being the dau. of Hugh Park McClurken, now I wonder which of the girls she was? & if she was one of Uncle Hugh's girls?

(grandfather of Miss Lois C. Meyer)

Son of John & Eliz (Park) McClurken was b near Rocky Creek, Chester District, So. Car. Nov. 6, 1821. His parents were among the early Covenanters of the South, & removed from that country on account of slavery, in the fall of 1833, & settled near Sparta, Randolph Co. Ill.

He received his early education in the schools of his native & adopted countries, & graduated from Duquesne College in 1845. He studied theology in the Cincinnati Seminary, & was licensed by the Lakes Presbytery, Apr. 20, 1848. He was ordained by the Pittsburg Presby, & installed pastor of the Salt Creek cong. (now New Concord), New Concord, Muskingham Co. Ohio. Oct. 15, 1850, & resigned this charge, Oct 8, 1856. He was re-installed pastor Dec. 2, 1858 & resigned Oct. 4, 1882. He was installed pastor of the cong. of Wahoo, Saunders Co. Neb. Feb. 29, 1884, where he is now in charge.

He married Miss Jane Orr of Pittsburgh, Pa. Jan 17, 1843. He was for many yrs. a Trustee of Muskingham College, & Pres, Pro Tem of that institution for 2 yrs, beginning in 1859. He was honored with the degree of Doctor of Divinity by Muskingham College in 1879. He was moderator of the Synod of 1868.

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Copy of a letter written to W.J. McClurken, son of Arch. McClurken, by Rev. J.J. McClurken to

New Alexandria, Pa.

June 29, 1896.

Dear Nephew;

Yours of May 2nd, 1896, was received in due time; & I now proceed to give you what information I can, respecting your & my ancestry.

Thos. McClurken, my g-father & your g-g-mother was about 16 yrs old, the time of the Rev. War. This I have from his own mouth. He said "his father had a farm well stocked (in So. Car) with cattle & horses, in Chester Dist. (They called the Counties, districts). The Eng. camping near by took all." Grandfather being young & inexperienced, hearing they were about to move their camp, went to the chief officer to ask some pay for the cattle, but behold you, his response was "Get out of this place you dog." And stamped his foot at him, & let down his brows. Grandfather said "he never was as glad in his life, to get away." Had the officer said the word, he would have been shot on the spot. In those days there were many loyal to King Geo. They were called Tories. These helped the English to select a suitable place for encampment & in many other ways encouraged them.

I never saw g-father's father or mother. I do not know whether they had moved to So. Car. before g-father was born or not. It is evident they were of Scotch origin, as the name McClurkin indicates.

Of the cemetery you speak of, that my son John saw in Ire. I have no knowledge. I will send him your letter & he can inform you what he knows about it.

G-father owned 4 negroes; viz, Adam & his wife, Tine, & 2 sons, Isaac & Jacob. When g-father joined the Cov. Church, he set them free. Our church never believed in slavery, always testified against it, & afterwards, the law of the State was so changed that no one could set his negroes free, however anxious to set them free, they might be. This was the condition of affairs when we moved from So. Car. in Dec. 1833; According to this date we landed at Arch. Hood's place after spending 6 weeks on the road, in a wagon with 4 horses, & another 1 horse carriage for g-mother & g-father & their only dau. Nancy McClurken, my Aunt Nancy. We were the last of the McClurkens that moved away from So. Car. the others had moved before us,

My g-mother was Smith, sister of old David Smith of Bloomington, Ind. No doubt your mother may have seen him when she was very young, at least she had heard of him. At all events your mother knows the family of Smiths about Bloomington. My g-mother was Smith, sister of David Smith, John Smith, & Jas Smith, & also a sister of Mrs. Donnelly, the wife of Rev. Thos. Donnelly, who was a preacher. These Smith's were born & educated in the principles of the Covenant Church in Scot. & Ire. I remember of seeing my g-g-mother Smith when she was 101 yrs of age, she lived with a dau. Mrs. Donnelly. My g-mother McClurken being so well indoctrinated in the principles of our church, no doubt helped g-father to see the evil of slavery & join the Cov. Church. Because he did so, he incurred the displeasure of his neighbors. Evidence of this we have in the way he was persecuted. 4 times in succession, thru spite work, he was subpoenaed to sit in court as a jurymen, this they knew he could not do, consistently with the position he had just professed as a Cov., consequently he paid his fine, which was \$20. & 4 times this is \$80, which they took out of his pocket, because he did not join some of the slave-holding churches; such as the Secession Church or the Asso. Ref. or Presby. These churches were many, if not all, originally from Ire. & Scot. & all opposed slavery at first, but fell in with slavery because the Constitution allowed it.

Grandfathers' family consisted of the following children; viz, John my father the oldest, Arch, Jas, Thos, David, & Nancy. All are now dead & buried in the same graveyard near Oakdale Ill. which used to be called Elkhorn Cemetery. My father & mother died in 1874, only 3 or 4 days between deaths. I ought to exempt Uncle Arch. McClurken, for I remember that he was buried in Pinkneyville Ill. near Chester Ill. I suppose all his family that is now dead are buried there. All these deaths remind me that I am the oldest McClurken now living of which I have any knowledge.

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Mathew McClurken, a brother of Thos. my g-father, moved from So. Car. before I was born. He raised a large family in Ohio, in the New Light Covenanter Church, some of whom moved to Iowa, near Morning Sun, & others went to Princeton Ind.

G-father had 4 Or 5 sisters or more, Mrs McClure, & Mrs Blair whom I have seen. The Blair family lives near Adamsville, in Mercer Co, Pa. The McClure family has moved to Iowa, near Morning Sun.

I am living a retired life, being put on the retired list of old super-annuated ministers. I am 84 yrs. old. I am trying like Moses to ascend Mt. Pisgah to see the heavenly Caanon, or like the worthies in Hebrews 11th chapter, I am a stranger & pilgrim seeking a better country,

Mrs McClurken joins me in sending her regards to you all. Your mother knows that her maiden name was Ewing, dau. of Robt. Ewing. Please answer me.

Died March 22, 1845

Applied for his pension in the Spring of 1833, Chester Co. S.C.

The following are his statements when applying for the pension;

Where were you born, and when?

"Emigrated to S.C. in 1772. Born in Ireland in 1756."

Have you any record of your age, and if so, where is it?

"I have no record of my age, my information on this subject was derived from my brother, Robert McClurken, now dead."

Where were you living when called into service; where have you lived since the Revolutionary War, and where do you live now?

"I was living in Camden District when first called into service, and have lived in Chester District on the same plantation I now occupy ever since the Rev. War. How were you called into service; were you drafted, did you volunteer, or were you a substitute, and if a substitute, for whom?

"I was first a substitute for Abraham Miller, afterwards I served occasionally as a volunteer, & was also drafted several times."

State the names of some of the regular officers who were with the troops where you served; such continental & militia regiments as you recollect, & the general circumstances of your service.

"I remember Gen. Green, Lt. Col. Washington, & Gen. Sumter. (Col. Tarleton took my brother, Archibald, from his house & had him hung to a Red Oak tree,) I do not at this time remember the names of any of the continental or militia regiments I was attached to. Col. Winn's Regiment, & refer to my narrative for the general circumstances of my service."

Did you ever receive a discharge from the service? And, if so, by whom was it given, and what became of it?

"I never received a written discharge from service. It was usual to give a verbal discharge."

State the names of persons to whom you are known in your neighborhood, and who can testify as to your character for veracity, and their belief of your service as a soldier in the Revolution.

"Rev. Mr. Davis, Jas Harbison, Dr John Douglass, and also, refer to the whole neighborhood in which I reside."

Jas. Graham takes oath that he served with Thomas McClurken in the Revolutionary War at Orangeburg, at Perrysburg & Charleston.

The following from the narrative of his service;

"I was a substitute for Abraham Miller in the Snowy Camp in the winter of

1775-76 under command of Capt. Alex. Turner, a detachment of us was ordered to Reedy River after Capt. Cunningham, afterwards a celebrated & bloody Tory Major. We discovered his party & fired at them. They dispersed, & we captured 21 of his Tory associates, marched them to 96, where we had them hand-cuffed, & chained, then took them to Charleston & lodged them in jail. We then returned home."

"About the last of Nov. or 1st of Dec. 1778, I was drafted under Capt. Turner. We were ordered to the low country, & about Monk's Corner, we became attached to Gen. Richardson, & after laying there some time, marched to the marter house near Charleston, from thence to Jacksonborough & Pocotaligo to Purysburgh, where we fell in with Gen. Lincoln, who commanded the Continental forces, our men were under the immediate command of Major Brown. We stayed at Purysburgh until our term of service expired & I returned home."

"Sometime in the year 1779, before the fall of Charleston, I was there as a Militia man, under Capt. Turner, & done duty 3 mos. in his company. I remember Col. Kershaw & Gen. Moultrie from Charleston. I returned home."

"In or about May 1780, Capt. Lacy raised a volunteer company of about 100 men. I volunteered under him. We were ordered after a party of Tories supposed to be at Mobley's Meeting House, where we found & killed a number of them, the remainder of their party fled when our company returned home. About the 1st of March 1781, Lt Jas Kennedy raised a small party of Whigs (I was one of the number) for the purpose of attacking a company of Tories who were at the plantation of Old Jas. Wylie. We routed them thru the old fields, after a short time they returned & owing to superior numbers, they compelled us to give way, after killing Samuel Wylie, the son of old Jas. Wylie. Our party killed a Tory, Fair."

"About the mo. of April 1781, I was with Capt Adams in the Indian Land where we remained a short time, & was dismissed. In the mo. of May 1781, Capt Adams again ordered me out. Our company was directed to procure provisions for Gen. Green's army. We did so, & was then ordered to Ft. Grabby (called the Congaree Ft.) which surrendered to Lt. Col. Lee. We were then dismissed."

"I was drafted in Feb. 1782 by Capt Cooper. Maj. Wallis & Gen. Henderson were our field officers. We marched to Orangeburg, where we were ordered to guard the jail, which had large number of prisoners. I remained there sometime, & returned home. This was my last Rev. service. I now live in the same neighborhood I lived in during the Rev. War."

That this wedding was before his own marriage which occurred on Jan 9, 1791. John McDill's first child was born Jan 12, 1792. John McDill served with Thomas McClurken in the Revolutionary War.
